## Fitting Guide for No Drill Roller Blinds


With Blinds4You, fitting for your beautiful new blind is easy. Just follow this step-by-step guide, taking care to double check as you go and look out for some handy tips to help you save time too. Below is a handy guide for fitting for No Drill Roller blinds.

### Recess Fitting Only

No Drill Blinds require no drilling or screwing with a friction based installation and are only suitable for installation inside the window recess.

### Before you begin


We will have positioned the controls where you requested during the ordering process. However if you decide to swap the side that they are on, direction of the roll or need to trim the blind further the controls can be removed by simply unplugging them from the tube.



### Fitting the blinds

#### Step One

Angle the roller blind into your recess with the tightener end pushed against the wall.





## Step Two

Keeping the pressure against the tightener end, bring the control end (with the chain) up to be level.

Release the pressure and blind should hold its position in place.




**Handy Tip:** Double check the roller blind is straight before moving on to next step. Using a spirit level will help. Also the operating chain should fall straight down due to gravity.

## Step Three

Finally, secure the blind in position by turning the tightener wheel until the fit is as tight as it can go, using the tightening tool.

If the tightener end is on the left hand side, rotate it towards you. If on the right, turn it away from you using the tightening tool.

**Handy Tip:** Turn the tightener wheel to its maximum to ensure a secure fit. If the "foot" of the mechanism spins rather than tightening, remove the blind from the window, tighten it slightly then restart the fitting steps.




## Child Safety - "P" Clip

We supply our No Drill Roller blinds with child safety devices.

The P-clip must be securely screwed to the wall to ensure the chain remains tensioned and out of reach of children. Slot the beaded chain into the "P-Clip".

Please note that the "P-Clip" must be installed to comply with the child safety regulations.



## WARNING

Young children can be strangled by loops in pull cords, chains, tapes and inner cords that operate the product.

To avoid strangulation and entanglement, keep cords out of the reach of young children. Cords may become wrapped around a child's neck. Move beds, cots and furniture away from window covering cords.

Do not tie cords together. Make sure cords do not twist and create a loop.




## Additional Information

### Reverse rolling the fabric


#### Standard roll

Roller blinds can have the fabric rolled onto the tube in two directions. The first is referred to as 'standard' roll. This will place the fabric closest to the window or wall so that it comes down at the back of the tube. This is typically used with blackout blinds when they are mounted outside of a recess, the standard roll meaning that there is less light leakage.




#### Reverse roll

The second method is referred to as a 'reverse' roll, which places the fabric so that it comes down at the front of the tube, effectively hiding the roll. This method will allow clearance behind the fabric, for window handles and other obstructions, if you're mounting the blind inside a recess.



#### Changing the roll method

If you wish to change the roll method then it's easy; simply pull the back of the chain to lower the blind, and continue pulling until the metal tube is exposed. Keep going and the blind will begin to raise, with the fabric now rolling up over the front of the roller tube. Note that this will reverse the direction you must pull the chain for raising and lowering the blind (you'll now use the front of the chain to lower and the back of the chain to raise).
